Safe Sitter® Essentials is a 1-day class designed to prepare students grades 6 - 8 to be safe when they're home alone, watching younger siblings, or babysitting.

The instructor-led class is filled with fun games and role-playing exercises. Students even get to use manikins to practice rescue skills like what to do when someone is choking!

SAFETY SKILLS

Students learn how to prevent unsafe situations and what to do when faced with dangers such as power failures or weather emergencies

The ability to screen jobs, discuss fees, and greet employers will set students up for success now and in the future. Students practice these skills through various role-plays.

Carrot Cake Smoothie

Servings: 2 Serving Size: 1.5 cups







Ingredients:

- 1 medium frozen ripe banana
- 2 medium carrots, chopped
- 1/2 cup canned-in-juice pineapple tidbits, drained
- 1/4 cup low-fat vanilla yogurt
- 1/2 cup nonfat milk
- 4-5 ice cubes
- Dash cinnamon (optional)
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract (optional)

Directions:

- 1. Wash hands with soap and warm water, scrubbing for at least 20 seconds.
- 2. **Rinse** carrots under cool running water and **scrub** with a clean vegetable brush to remove any dirt before chopping.
- 3. Add banana, carrot, pineapple, yogurt, milk, ice, and cinnamon and vanilla (if using) to a blender, and **blend** until smooth. If needed, **add** more milk to encourage blending.
- 4. Refrigerate leftovers.
